Primary Job Responsibilities

- Lead hikes and nature-related programming for the children in your camp group and participate in daily camp activities with the campers.
- Help create a summer camp that is educational and safe, ensuring a friendly and secure experience for all children attending the Baltimore Woods Nature Center Summer Nature Day Camp program.
- Be on-site each day of week-long camps, Monday Friday, 8:30am-3:30pm.
- Coordinate and oversee daily camp activities with your camp volunteer, adhering to all health and safety procedures as outlined in the camp manual.
- Other duties as requested.

Qualifications

- 21 years or older
- Current teaching certificate preferred, and/or two seasons experience working with children in a camp setting.
- Excellent interpersonal, communication, and group management skills.
- Understanding of natural science themes, nature-play, and interpretation.
- Have reliable transportation.
- Current First Aid Responding to Emergencies (or equivalent) certification and CPR for the Professional Rescuer (with AED) certification. Training is provided, if needed.
- Ability to work 6-8 weeks during the summer (July and August) and attend staff training the week of July 4th.
