Camp Director and Program Manager Tom Meier put his photography skills and love of ferns together for his contribution of "Unfurling Maidenhair." He also takes the opportunity to educate with this statement: "Northern maidenhair ferns can be found all along the Valley Trail at Baltimore Woods. The unfurling fiddleheads can form intricate twisting shapes that fascinate me. An even closer look reveals delicate pinnae (leaves) and the complexity of even the smallest things in nature."
